Did you know that there are a lot of nature activities you can do outside even when it's cold?

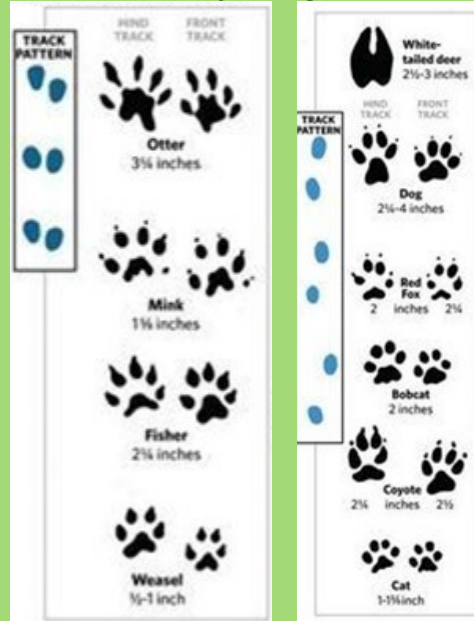

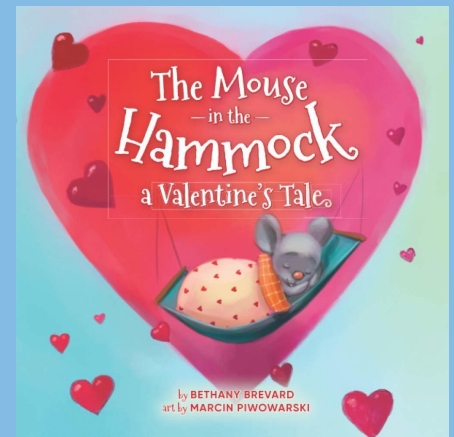

JOB OPPORTUNITIES

Conservation Seasonal Intern: Wage: \$10-11 per hour.

Description: The Seasonal Intern/Summer help position is a position that will help maintain the grounds and structures in all Calhoun County Conservation areas running May through September. The employees will be given the opportunity to learn how to operate different equipment including; chainsaws, tractors, skid loaders, and mowers. Employees will work an average of 40 hours a week with possibly some weekends and holidays required. The work setting is primarily outdoors and the areas include campgrounds, public hunting areas, prairies, trails, and shop work.

Cabin Cleaner: Wage: \$15.00 per hour

Description: The Calhoun County Conservation Board has an opening for a Cabin Cleaner, located at Featherstone Park for the 2021 recreational camping season. Featherstone Park is located on North Twin Lake in Calhoun County. The campground has seven cabins, two large cabins, and five smaller cabins. The cleaner will be supplied with all the cleaning supplies and will have to be available during different dates throughout the camping season. Cabin Cleaners will be able to stay out at Featherstone Park in a full hook-up spot by providing their own camping unit (camping rates will apply). Position starts approximately April 9th and terminates approximately December 10th (dates may change dependent on occupancy and weather). Hours and days are dependent on reservations. Applicants should be friendly, dependable, and can work at appropriate speeds.
