John Maddox asked for clarification about putting a question on the ballot restricting the number of licenses for LMEs. Solicitor Cox informed that the Council and the Mayor can act to put a question on the ballot or a citizen petition can be placed on the ballot which is provided for by the City Charter. This would have no effect on the special permits that have already been filed. Some of the concerns Dr. Maddox voiced were about the amount of vape shops/stores and perceived risk to young adults,* the need for an annual high school risk survey which costs \$10K, lack of a public health department, community service hours for education.
