MR. WARD REVIEWED THE SEQUENCE OF EVENTS ON DEC.11TH WHICH LED TO THE VIOLATION RELATED TO THE DISENFECTING PROCESS. THE PLANT LOST POWER AND THE STAN DARD OPERATING PROCEDURE WAS NOT FOLLOWED. THE FOLLOWING DAY THEY MET WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND WERE TOLD THERE WAS NO CONCERN. THE PUBLIC WAS NOT PUT AT RISK. THERE WERE NO EXCEEDANCE OF CONTAMINANTS IN THE WATER.SAFEGUARDS WERE IMMEDITATELY PUT IN PLACE TO PREVENT THIS FROM HAPPENING IN THE FUTURE. ON FEB 7TH THEY RECEIVED NOTIFICATION FROM DEP THAT THEY HAD TO GIVE PUBLIC NOTICE. COUNCIL EXPRESSED CONCERN THAT THEY WERE NOT NOTIFIED OF THIS ISSUE IN ADVANCE.

ORLANDO PACHECO, HAVERHILL ENERGY MANAGER, ANSWERED QUESTIONS FROM COUNCILLORS.

THIS IS A FREE SERVICE. HOWEVER, THERE IS AN ENERGY EFFICIENCY CHARGE IN THE NATIONAL GRID ELECTRIC BILLS THAT EVERYONE ALREADY PAYS. HOME WORKS COMES INTO YOUR HOME AND CONDUCTS A SURVEY OF ENERGY USE AND WILL SWITCH OUT LIGHT BULBS, SHOWER HEAD(S). HAVERHILL WAS SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN NATIONAL GRID COMMUNITY INITIATIVE GRANT. ONE OF THE GOALS IS TO HAVE 1143 HOME ENERGY ASSESSMENTS COMPLETED.

KEITH BOUCHER OF URBAN KINDNESS URGED CITY TO DEVELOP A PLAN FOR PLOWING SIDEWALKS. LARRY NEWMAN SUGGESTED THE USE OF ROBO CALLS TO ALERT PEOPLE OF POTENTIAL TICKETING/TOWING OF VEHICLES. STEPHANIE LESICZKA, PLOW DRIVER, SPOKE ABOUT THE INTENSITY OF THE STORM AND SUPPORT OF ALTERNATE STREET PARKING.

MIKE STANKOVICH, PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR, GAVE AN EXPLANATION OF THE STORM/DEVELOPMENT. 185 PIECES OF EQUIPMENT WERE DEPLOYED. THERE WAS 14" OF SNOW ENDING WITH FREEZING RAIN. ONE GRADER WENT DOWN. HE IS GETTING PRICING OF GRADERS AS ONE IS 27 YEARS OLD AND ANOTHER IS 23 YEARS OLD. CONSIDERING RENTING. SUGGESTED EDUCATING RESIDENTS ABOUT SNOW REMOVAL POLICY FOR SIDEWALKS. PLACED ON FILE
