Mayor Declares Snow Emergency

Today, Mayor James J. Fiorentini announced that the City is in preparation mode for the historic snow storm that is predicted to hit our area over the next two days. The Mayor met yesterday with his emergency team to prepare the City for the storm. The City will have 6 sanders out on the streets today by 10AM and 140 snow plows on the streets by 11AM. There are over 1,400 streets in the City with over 456 lane miles of roadway. If you have any snow plowing issues, please call the Highway Dispatch phone number at 978-374-2364.

The Citizens Center will be utilized as a shelter if necessary, they are located at 10 Welcome Street in Haverhill. If you need shelter, please call the Haverhill Police Department at 978-373-1212.

Trash pick-up started early today to give the trucks a jump on the storm and to get them off the streets early. The Recycling Center at 500 Primrose Street will be closed tomorrow, Saturday, February 9th due to the storm.

The Mayor has declared a Snow Emergency as of 12 noon today. The streets need to be cleared for safety. Please note that there are 10 municipal lots available for parking plus the Haverhill Public Library lot, the Tilton Elementary School at 70 Grove Street and the Consentino Middle School at 685 Washington Street (parking on the left side of the school as you face the building only). All cars need to be removed from the municipal lots by 12 noon on Sunday, February 10th. There is also parking at the lot across from All Saints Church, vehicles need to be removed early Sunday morning. The MVRTA Garage and the MBTA lots are also open for parking.

Mayor Fiorentini stated:

“I encourage residents to stay off the roads and remain at home to weather out the storm if possible. Please do not park on the streets this evening.

“The main concern is for everyone to remain safe. Do not go near any downed power lines. Please check on your elderly neighbors to make sure they are safe and be careful when shoveling as to not over exert yourself.”
