Curbside bins are available at the Solid Waste office for pick-up

## CURBSIDE GUIDELINES

Bins need to be at the street by 6 a.m. to ensure collection

\*Notice - Effective July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2019 - Oils are no longer accepted curbside; residents may bring their used motor oil and strained cooking oil to the Solid Waste Complex at 91 New Street M-F 7:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M.\*

### CARDBOARD & PAPER

RECYCLE: Phone books, newspapers, magazines and inserts, catalogs, hard-back books, paper-back books, discarded mail, cereal boxes, soft drink cartons, cardboard, paper and gray board.

COLLECTION: Remove inner materials and flatten. Flatten corrugated cardboard and reduce to 24"x 24" pieces

NON-RECYCLABLE: Shredded paper

### ALUMINUM CANS

RECYCLE: Beverage cans.

COLLECTION: Empty contents

NON-RECYCLABLE: Tin cans, paper and plastic cans, paint cans, buckets and foil

### GLASS

RECYCLE: Clear, green and brown glass

COLLECTION: Empty contents, rinse, remove lid

NON-RECYCLABLE: Light bulbs, plate glass, mirrors, and drinking glasses

### PLASTIC (Notice Recent Changes)

RECYCLE: Plastic containers with the #1 or #2 insignia on the bottom of the following containers: milk bottles, laundry, bleach, and fabric softener containers, drink bottles such as water, juice, soda bottles, etc.

Collection: Rinse, remove lid, and crush

ONLY THE PLASTICS LISTED ABOVE WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING

### BATTERIES (Bring to 91 New St Johnson City)

RECYCLE: Automobile batteries. Rechargeable and non-rechargeable household batteries

COLLECTION: Tape ends of the household batteries & place in a sealed plastic bag. Place batteries in the e-waste container.

### APPLIANCES

RECYCLE: Household appliances: refrigerators, water heaters, dishwashers, stoves, washers and dryers

COLLECTION: Call 423-975-2700 for details to schedule collection

# DROP OFF SITE AT 91 NEW STREET

The items below may be dropped off at the 91 New St location  
Monday – Friday, 7:00 A.M. – 4:30 P.M.

## PROPANE TANKS

RECYCLE: Empty 20 lb. propane tanks only

COLLECTION: Tanks are accepted at Solid Waste Services M-F 7:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

## FLUORESCENT TUBES & BULBS

RECYCLE: Fluorescent tubes and compact fluorescent lights

Place tube or bulb in original packaging, if unavailable wrap in newspaper. Only four (4) tubes per visit.

No limit of CFL's. Accepted at Solid Waste Services M-F 7:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

NON-ACCEPTED: Tubes over 4' in length. No commercial tubes or bulbs.

## E-WASTE

RECYCLE: Computers, cell phones, monitors, scanners, keyboards, printers, DVDs/VCRs, telephones, CD players, microwaves, TVs

E-waste is accepted at Solid Waste Services M-F 7:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

## OILS

RECYCLE: Used motor oil and strained cooking oil.

NON-ACCEPTED: Kerosene, gasoline, brake or transmission fluids, paint thinners or other liquids

Oils are accepted at Solid Waste Services M-F 7:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
