

ORDINANCE 2021-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2021 CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND – GULF BOULEVARD UNDERGROUNDING & BEAUTIFICATION BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE \$427,760 IN PENNY FOR PINELLAS IV FUNDING FROM PINELLAS COUNTY AS REFLECTED IN THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; CONFLICT; AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2020-07, the City of Treasure Island, Florida adopted an annual operating budget for fiscal year 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Big-C, consisting of Pinellas County beach communities and Pinellas County negotiated an Interlocal Agreement to continue the Gulf Blvd Undergrounding Project with the passage of the Penny for Pinellas IV referendum; and

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Agreement was executed after the adoption of the current budget, therefore the project budget requires a budget amendment to reflect the City's funding for FY 2021 in the amount of \$427,760; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City's Charter and generally accepted accounting principles, the City of Treasure Island finds it in the public's best interest to amend the City's budget to appropriate the share of the County's Penny for Pinellas IV funding to the City of Treasure Island for the continuation of the Gulf Blvd Undergrounding Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. The recitals set forth in the "Whereas" clauses above are ratified and confirmed as true and correct, and are hereby adopted as legislative findings by the City Commission of the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the adoption of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. The Gulf Blvd Undergrounding & Beautification – Capital Project fund for the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the fiscal year 2021, as adopted pursuant to Ordinance 2020-07, is hereby amended to appropriate \$427,760 in funding from Pinellas County's portion of the Penny for Pinellas IV, as reflected in the executed Interlocal Agreement dated October 20, 2020.

SECTION 3. That allocation of said funds shall be as follows:

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. It is declared to be the intent of the City Commission, that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 5. CONFLICT. This action supersedes all ordinances and resolutions of the City or portions thereof, in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage.

SECOND READING and PUBLIC HEARING on the 6th day of April, 2021.




