

ORDINANCE 2021-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2021 PENNY FOR PINELLAS FUND BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE \$51,000 FROM THE INSURANCE PROCEEDS AND THE UNDESIGNATED FUND BALANCES FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF A POLICE VEHICLE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; CONFLICT; AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2020-07, the City of Treasure Island, Florida adopted an annual operating budget for fiscal year 2021; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2021 a police cruiser (city vehicle #784) was involved in an accident with another motorist; and

WHEREAS, the City's insurance carrier determined the vehicle to be a total loss and will issue the City a settlement check totaling \$27,074; and

WHEREAS, the total replacement cost of the vehicle and related equipment is \$51,000; and

WHEREAS, the difference between the replacement cost of the vehicle and the insurance proceeds is \$27,074 and will be appropriated from the Penny for Pinellas undesignated fund balance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City's Charter and generally accepted accounting principles, the City of Treasure Island finds it in the public's best interest to amend the City's budget to appropriate \$27,074 in insurance proceeds and appropriate \$23,926 from the Penny for Pinellas undesignated Fund Balance to enable the purchase of a police vehicle replacement for a total of \$51,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. The recitals set forth in the "Whereas" clauses above are ratified and confirmed as true and correct, and are hereby adopted as legislative findings by the City Commission of the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the adoption of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. The Penny for Pinellas Fund budget for the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the fiscal year 2021, as adopted pursuant to Ordinance 2020-07, is hereby amended by appropriating \$51,000 from insurance proceeds and the undesignated fund balance for the replacement of a police cruiser.

SECTION 3. That allocation of said funds shall be as follows:

<u>Penny for Pinellas – Revenue</u>		
Settlements – Insurance Proceeds	123-369300	\$27,074
Undesignated fund balance		\$23,926

<u>Penny for Pinellas - Expense</u>		
Public Safety Vehicle	123-5300-64920	\$51,000

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. It is declared to be the intent of the City Commission, that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held

invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 5. CONFLICT. This action supersedes all ordinances and resolutions of the City or portions thereof, in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage.

FIRST READING and PUBLIC HEARING on the 4th day of May, 2021.

SECOND READING and PUBLIC HEARING on the 18th day of May, 2021.


