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Any charge established in this fee schedule (Appendix A) may be waived or reduced by the City Commission upon a finding that extraordinary conditions warrant such a waiver or reduction, so long as said waiver or reduction is not prohibited or restricted by applicable federal, state or local law.

ARTICLE I. COMMUNITY Development

1. Building Permits (Chapter 8, Treasure Island Code of Ordinances [Code], 8-31 TI-Code)
 - a. Base Fee – For issuing each permit: \$50 [Florida Building Code (FBC) – Section 109 Fees]
 - b. Total Valuation Fee – \$1,000 or less – base fee only \$50 (where only a final inspection is required – each additional inspection required shall be charged \$50. If, in the opinion of the building official, the valuation for the scope of work: construction, addition, alteration, repair, remodel, and/or replacement appears to be understated or underestimated on the application, the permit shall be denied, unless the applicant can show detailed estimates or a copy of the contract to meet the approval of the building official. (FBC)– Section 109, Schedule of Permit]
 - c. Total Valuation Fee – over \$1,000 and less than \$1,000,000 – Base fee of \$50 plus \$10 for each thousand or fraction thereof; \$1,000,000 or over – Base fee of \$50 plus \$7 for each thousand or fraction thereof. If, in the opinion of the building official, the valuation for the scope of work: construction, addition, alteration, repair, remodel, and/or replacement appears to be understated or underestimated on the application, the permit shall be denied, unless the applicant can show detailed estimates or a copy of the contract to meet the approval of the building official. [FBC– Section 109 Fees]
 - d. State Surcharge pursuant to section 553.721, Florida Statutes – A surcharge assessed at the rate of 1 percent of the permit fees associated with the enforcement of the Florida Building Code. The minimum amount collected on any permit issued shall be \$2. (Required by section 553.721, Florida Statutes)
 - e. State Surcharge pursuant to section 468.631, Florida Statutes – A surcharge assessed at the rate of 1.5 percent of all permit fees associated with enforcement of the Florida Building Code. The minimum amount collected on any permit shall be \$2. (Required by section 468.631, Florida Statutes).
 - f. Fee for Re-inspection – The contractor shall pay a re-inspection fee of \$50 for each inspection failure.
 - g. Fee for revision to an Existing Permit or Partial Inspection Request:
 - i. A revision to an existing permit shall be charged a \$50 revision fee, plus any valuation fees (as provided in subsections b or c above) and State Surcharges.
 - ii. A request for a partial inspection shall be charged \$50 per partial inspection requested.

- b. Fee for Extension of Time on a Permit
 - i. Extension of a building permit which has not yet expired and fulfills the “permit intent” of FBC – Section 105.4.1 - \$100
 - ii. Extension of a building permit which has been expired – applicant must reapply for a new permit (FBC - Section 105.4.1.1)
- c. Fee for a Same Day Inspection - \$40 and this service is subject to the availability of an inspector to provide this service
- d. Fee per Tent for Special Events, Permit Contractor Change, Contractor Trailer, Contractor Storage Trailer, Temporary Power Pole, Temporary Structures, and per Tree permitted to be removed – Fees for permits where no work valuation is pertinent shall be based upon an initial fee of \$50 covering one inspection and a fee of \$50 for each additional inspection required. The number of inspections required shall be at the discretion of the City Commission, City Manager, Community Development Director, Fire Department, or Building Official as the situation warrants.
 - i. After a tree removal has been permitted, a donation may be made to the Green Utility account in lieu of re-planting tree(s) – Section 72-111(b) of the City of Treasure Island Land Development Regulations (TI-LDR). The fee in lieu shall be based on the cost of purchasing the requisite size and number of replacement trees.
 - ii. Tree removal which is exempt under section 163.045, Florida Statutes - \$0 (Sec. 72-111, TI-LDR)
 - iii. Tree removal which is not exempt under section 163.045, Florida Statutes - \$50 (Sec. 72-111, TI-LDR)
 - iv. After the fact tree removal which is not exempt under section 163.045, Florida Statutes - \$100 (Sec. 72-111, TI-LDR)
- e. Moving Fee and Demolition Fee – for the demolition or the moving of any building or structure, the fee shall be \$150
 - i. Valuation of Moving or Demolition Work of \$0 to \$15,000 = \$150
 - ii. Valuation of Moving or Demolition Work greater than \$15,000 = 1% of moving or demolition cost
- f. Plan Review Fees – When a permit is required to be submitted, the respective plan review fees shall be paid to the City at the time of submitting the permit application, plans, and/or specifications for checking—this is a nonrefundable fee. The remaining balance(s) shall be paid upon permit issuance. Fees to be set as follows:
 - i. Building plan review fee - equal to one-half of the total building permit fee
 - 1. Each subsequent review – projects below \$10,000 in value – 10% of building permit fee
 - 2. Each subsequent review – projects \$10,000 and above in value – 5% of building permit fee

- ii. Floodplain plan review fee – equal to one-half of the total floodplain permit fee. (LDR Division 3 & Sec. 66-103.3).
 - iii. Zoning plan review fee – equal to one-half of the zoning permit fee. [Sec. 68-32, TI-LDR& Sec. 70-51, TI-LDR].
 - iv. Fire plan review fee – the respective costs at time of submittal as listed in Exhibit A for Fire and Rescue fee schedule. (National Fire Protection Association)
 - v. Civil or structural engineering review fee – equal to one-half of the total civil or structural permit fee
 - vi. Public works review fee – Equal to one half the public works permit fee
- g. Refunds of permit fee only (not plan review or other Community Development Department fees)
- 1. Work has not commenced, and the permit is less than six months old – Permit fee and state surcharges paid minus \$75
 - 2. Work has commenced or the permit is over six months old – no refund.
- h. After the Fact Permit - Where a permit is required by the Code of Ordinances and/or Land Development Regulations the work is started prior to obtaining the permit, the (permit fees) herein specified shall be:
- i. Two (2) times the permit fee, on the 1st occurrence by the property owner and/or contractor;
 - ii. Three (3) times the permit fee, on the 2nd occurrence by the property owner and/or contractor;
 - iii. Five (5) times the permit fee, each time thereafter by the property owner and/or contractor.
 - iv. The payment of the five (5) times fee shall not relieve any persons from fully complying with the requirement of the Code of Ordinances and Land Development Regulations. [FBC – Section 109.4, Work commencing before permit issuance]

ARTICLE V. PUBLIC RECORDS

Recognizing that all public records and documents subject under State law to inspection by members of the public at reasonable times and under reasonable circumstances, should be produced and made available to the public promptly, when the nature or volume of public records requested to be inspected, examined, or copied is such as to require extensive use of technology resources or extensive clerical or supervisory assistance (“extensive use of information technology resources or extensive clerical or supervisory assistance” is defined as more than thirty (30) minutes of staff time per request), a special service charge shall be imposed, in addition to the charge for

copies. The party requesting such assistance or service shall be charged a fee that shall be equivalent to the hourly wage of the employee who renders such assistance, including in the hourly wage the cost to the City of all benefits paid to the employee. The special service charge will be computed to the nearest quarter of an hour exceeding the first thirty (30) minutes. If the records requested are stored on computer and must be retrieved and reproduced from such storage, the charges for such reproduced copies shall be based on the time necessary to generate and reproduce such records. The City may require a deposit equal to the estimated amount for copies, any applicable service charges for extensive requests and, when applicable, the cost of mailing prior to gathering the records requested. If the City's cost to provide the records is less than that amount provided in the deposit, the remaining amount of the deposit shall be returned to the requesting party. In the event the City incurs charges in an amount greater than the deposit, the City shall issue an invoice to the requesting party for the additional charges which shall be payable prior to or upon receipt of the documents requested.
