

ORDINANCE 2021-04

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND,
FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2021 GENERAL
FUND BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE \$13,600 IN EMS FUNDING
FROM PINELLAS COUNTY FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE
RESCUE JET SKI AND ANCILLARY EQUIPMENT; PROVIDING
FOR SEVERABILITY; CONFLICT; AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2020-07, the City of Treasure Island, Florida adopted an annual operating budget for fiscal year 2021; and

WHEREAS, Pinellas County EMS has agreed to pay for the replacement of the Rescue Jet Ski to replace the current one that has been taken out of service due to significant repairs required; and

WHEREAS, this budget amendment will appropriate \$13,600 in additional EMS funding from Pinellas County for the purchase of the replacement jet ski and ancillary equipment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the City's Charter and generally accepted accounting principles, the City of Treasure Island finds it in the public's best interest to amend the City's budget to appropriate additional EMS Funding from Pinellas County for the replacement of the rescue jet ski.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. The recitals set forth in the "Whereas" clauses above are ratified and confirmed as true and correct, and are hereby adopted as legislative findings by the City Commission of the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the adoption of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. The General Fund Budget for the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the fiscal year 2021, as adopted pursuant to Ordinance 2020-07, is hereby amended to appropriate EMS Funding from Pinellas County for replacement of the rescue jet ski and ancillary equipment.

SECTION 3. That allocation of said funds shall be as follows:

<u>General Fund</u>

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. It is declared to be the intent of the City Commission, that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.



SECTION 5. CONFLICT. This action supersedes all ordinances and resolutions of the City or portions thereof, in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage.

FIRST READING and PUBLIC HEARING on the 19th day of January, 2021.

SECOND READING and PUBLIC HEARING on the 16th day of February, 2021.


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
